

Llangennech, including rolling field systems, old oak woodland and quiet country lanes.

Walk C, 6.5 miles (10.4 km), takes in the wider landscape of coastlines and beyond.

for some fine views of the Lougaber estuary, the Gower coastline and beyond.

Walk B, 4.5 miles (7.2 km), covers the old track out instead of the footpaths through Tyregwyns Farm.

Walk A, 3.5 miles (5.6 kilometres), includes the banks of the Afon Morlais as well as country lanes and woodland tracks. An alternative route, avoiding steps, is to use Troserch Road instead of the footpaths through Tyregwyns Farm.

Afon Morlais is also a source of pride for the greater viewpoints on all three walks and no shortage of birds!

Birdwatchers are also well used to the greater variety of birds found in the weather has been wet, so stout footwear is recommended to involve slides, kissing gates and steps. The paths can be muddy Llangennech itself. All the walks are fully waymarked and all starting point is at the car park off the Trosedd Wood - and a handy place to park the car and make a start. 
